

# DAY OUT TO THE NORTHUMBERLAND COAST



Travel south on the A1 from Berwick to Belford then follow the scenic Northumberland Coastal Route via Bamburgh to Seahouses, where you will find traditional methods being used to produce kippers in the UK's oldest working smokehouse.

The suggested route continues southwards through Craster to Alnwick then back via the A1. Alternatively, you can return direct to Berwick.

If travelling by car or bike, you may choose to make a stop at The Barn at Beal or at Sunnyhills Farm Shop and Cafe at Belford.

At **Robert Carter**, butchers, **Clarke's** greengrocers and **The Pantry** deli, you can buy home-made pies, seasonal vegetables, **Chain Bridge Honey**, **Doddington Cheeses**, **Heatherslaw Biscuits** and other "goodies".

### SEAHOUSES

**The Fisherman's Kitchen** beside the smokehouse of **Swallow Fish Ltd.** in South Lane sells a wide range of fresh and smoked fish and seafood such as salmon smokies, prawns, kipper paté and smoked mussels

**Trotter's Bakers** and **The Northumbrian Hamper** in the village's main street offer a variety of home-baking and locally-sourced produce such as **Doddington Dairy** cheeses and ice-cream.

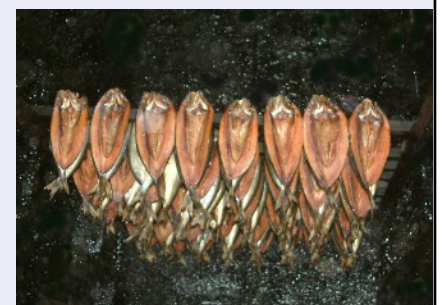


## THE HOME OF THE KIPPER

It is said that the first kippers as we know them today were produced in Seahouses in 1843 by a herring-curer called John Woodger.

By the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> century almost every community on the North Sea coast had at least one smokehouse.

You will still find traditional smokehouses operated by **Swallow Fish Ltd.** at Seahouses and **L. Robson & Sons Ltd.** at Craster, a little further down the coast.
