

# DAY OUT TO ORD & NORHAM



This route takes you along the Tweed valley to the villages of East Ord and Norham.

The River Tweed is famous for its wild salmon and the Tweed Valley is a fertile agricultural area where vast quantities of barley and other cereals are farmed, as well as traditionally-raised cattle, sheep and pigs.

Norham is a peaceful village today, but its mighty Norman castle was considered to be England's "most dangerous place" during the Anglo-Scottish wars of the Middle Ages.

## EVERYTHING YOU WILL NEED FOR A PICNIC

### EAST ORD

**Berwick Garden Centre** at East Ord stocks a wide range of food and drink from Northumberland and the Scottish Borders to take home or add to your picnic.

A short walk from the nearby picnic area takes you down beside the River Tweed and the ruins of the old Needle's Eye salmon fishermen's shiel.



### NORHAM

The Castle grounds, the attractive village green with its old market cross and the nearby banks of the River Tweed all provide excellent spots for a picnic.

You can purchase the food you may need for your picnic at family-run shops located in the main street, just a few metres from the bus stop.

**R. G. Foreman & Sons**, butcher and game-dealer, has been in business in Norham since 1840. The beef, lamb, pork and game from local farms and estates that is sold in the shop is also used in their fresh sandwiches, home-made pies and cooked meats.

Foreman's stocks a wide range of local cheeses, too.

The bread, biscuits and cakes baked by **James Ford & Son** on their premises and sold from their shop in the village will make ideal additions to your picnic fare.

If you are planning a visit to Norham, please note that Foreman's and Ford's shops are both closed all day on Mondays.



## SALMON FROM THE SILVERY TWEED



Salmon-fishing was central to the livelihoods of the communities in the Tweed Valley for hundreds of years. Until the 1980s, there were dozens of salmon-fisheries along the Tweed. Most have been closed to commercial netting but the past importance of the industry is illustrated by the salmon-shaped weather-vane that tops the old cross on Norham village green.
